- 2. Our Club House will be closed with security turned "ON",
- 3. Water will be turned "OFF",
- 4. You can still use Court Reserve to book your court time, and
- 5. You will be responsible for sweeping the court and lines before you play, as needed.

President's Note (Carolyn Condon)

Well this certainly has been a season of changes and challenges! The club received so much rain and so often, it really messed up our games. I want to thank Robert and Andrew Szilagyi, our Club Pros, for offering to run the club for the last 6 to 8 weeks as Managers, which has been a huge help to the entire membership. The top priority for QPTC is a new sprinkler system; we are narrowing down our options and will send more details within the next few weeks.

The club settled our bank loan, so we are presently debt free. (Drum roll please!!!!) A sincere thank you to Forge who has given and continues to support, and share his many years of experience as President, to aid me in this new position. And a huge thank you to all members who continue to come forward to give their time and energy for the betterment of our club.

Property Update (Forge Hamu)

Well, considering the overwhelming amount of rain this year and the number of rainouts, one has to appreciate and notice that the courts are draining faster. It may not have felt that way, given the number of rain days, but for those who have been around the club for years, you must have noticed that puddles are at a minimum and courts are returned to playable status quicker than in the past (and with less labour cost).

We have some repairs which are being planned for the spring, namely the facia boards on the clubhouse are rotting and in need of replacement. Our nets are in good shape as are our windscreens, so purchases this coming year may be reduced somewhat and we can focus our expenditures on the above-ground sprinkler system which is currently being investigated.

For those of you who were down at the clubhouse during our most recent event (Doors Open Peterborough), you may have noticed how nice the clubhouse and grounds looked. A big thanks to our current President who was relentless in making sure everything was ready and looking pristine for visitors.

We have experienced some issues with both ball machines which have been out of commission for several weeks. We have recently been successful in getting one of the machines up and running, however, we have to limit its use to Court 2 as the battery for the unit is not operational and the machine can only be used with a constant power source via an extension cord. We will be looking into ordering a new battery for the unit, however, as these batteries are somewhat sensitive if left flat for extended periods of time (winter months), we will look to order the new battery for next season.


Membership (Heather Shute)
